I. The Annual Organizational and Regular Meeting of the Tuscarawas Valley Local Board of Education was called to order by President Susan Kaschak on Monday, January 11, 2016, at 7:05pm in the TVHS auditorium. Roll call showed the following members present: Mrs. Burrier, yes; Mr. Gooding, no; Mrs. Green, yes; Mr. Knaack, yes; Mrs. Kaschak, yes.

ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING

Mr. Knaack moved and Mrs. Green seconded a motion to nominate Susan Kaschak as President of the Tuscarawas Valley Local Board of Education and to close nominations for that office. Roll call on motions: Mrs. Burrier, yes; Mrs. Green, yes; Mr. Knaack, yes; Mrs. Kaschak, yes. Motion carried.
- 1/2/16 B. Mrs. Green moved and Mr. Knaack seconded a motion to nominate Richard Gooding as Vice President of the Tuscarawas Valley Local Board of Education and to close nominations for that office. Roll call on motions: Mrs. Burrier, yes; Mrs. Green, yes; Mr. Knaack, yes; Mrs. Kaschak, yes. Motion carried.

III. NEW BUSINESS/CONSENT AGENDA (ORGANIZATIONAL)

- A. Mrs. Burrier moved, Mrs. Green seconded, and all members present voted yes to schedule Regular Meetings for the second Monday of each month at 7pm at Tuscarawas Valley High School.
- B. Mr. Knaack moved, Mrs. Green seconded, and all members present voted yes to establish a Service Fund, as provided by ORC 3315.15, in the amount of \$5,000 to pay expenses actually incurred by Board of Education members or their official representatives in the performance of their duties.
- C. Mr. Knaack moved, Mrs. Burrier seconded, and all members present voted yes to establish board member compensation at the rate of \$70 per meeting up to 12 meetings per year.
- D. Mrs. Green moved, Mr. Knaack seconded, and all members present voted yes to the following Annual Business Resolutions for the year 2016, as listed:
 - 1. Authorize the Treasurer to secure advances from the County Auditor when funds are available and payable to the school district.
 - 2. Authorize the Treasurer to invest interim funds at the most productive interest rate whenever interim funds are available.
 - Authorize the Treasurer to pay bills within the limits of the appropriation resolution as bills are received and when the merchandise has been received in good condition or services have been performed in an acceptable manner.
 - Authorize the Treasurer to make modifications to appropriations and to make fund transfers or advances when necessary. A list of these changes is to be given to the Board at the regular monthly meeting immediately following the transfers or advances.
 - **5.** Authorize the Treasurer to act as custodian of the district safety deposit box.
 - **6.** Authorize the Board President and Treasurer to borrow money, if needed.
 - Authorize the Superintendent to employ certificated or non-certificated personnel prior to approval by the Board when such employment is required to maintain continuity of the educational program. Employment shall be presented and recommended for Board approval at the next Regular Meeting.
 - **8.** Authorize the Superintendent to serve as purchasing agent for the school district.
 - Authorize the Superintendent to act for the Board on matters pertaining to surplus property procured and federal grants.
 - 10. Authorize the Superintendent to approve attendance at professional meetings for all school district personnel.

- **15.** Authorize the Superintendent to serve as Civil Rights Coordinator.
- **16.** Recognize OAPSE Chapter #634 and the Tuscarawas Valley Teachers' Association as bargaining agents.
- 17. Designate The Times Reporter as the official newspaper for the school district.
- **18.** Designate the Superintendent and the President of the Board of Education as the official spokespersons for the school district.

VII. Mrs. Green moved, Mr. Knaack seconded, and all member present voted yes to approve the following resolution to invoice the Ohio Department of Education for past charter school deductions from state funding:

WHEREAS, it is the statutory duty of the Tuscarawas Valley Local School District Board of Education to deliver the educational programs and services to the school children of the Tuscarawas Valley Local School District, and

WHEREAS, the members of the Board are elected by the Tuscarawas Valley school community to ensure an effective, efficient, vibrant and productive system, and

WHEREAS, the elected board of education is responsible to the community including taxpayers, parents and other patrons, as well as the state, and

WHEREAS, the charter school industry now extracts in the range of one billion dollars (\$1,000,000,000) ANNUALLY from public school districts across the State of Ohio, and

WHEREAS, school district boards of education have no control of students, financing, educational programming and student outcomes who enroll in charter schools, and

WHEREAS, charter schools as a group in Ohio demonstrate low academic performance compared to traditional public schools, and

WHEREAS, the fraud and corruption in charter schools, as reported repeatedly in the public media, has made Ohio the laughing stock throughout the nation, and

WHEREAS, Ohio has been dubbed as the "Wild, Wild West" in charter operations, and

WHEREAS, the Tuscarawas Valley Local School District has lost a total of \$2,242,230 in state AND local funding to charter schools over the period FY 2002 to FY 2015, and

WHEREAS, this deduction has reduced programs and services to Tuscarawas Valley Local School District students, and

WHEREAS, the Tuscarawas Valley Local School District Board of Education has a fiduciary responsibility to the students and taxpayers of the District, be it therefore

RESOLVED that the Board of Education directs the Treasurer of the District to invoice the State of Ohio for all the funds extracted from the Tuscarawas Valley Local School District for charter school students.
