The funds for the sign came from money earned by a car wash, a paper drive, and from the club's treasury.

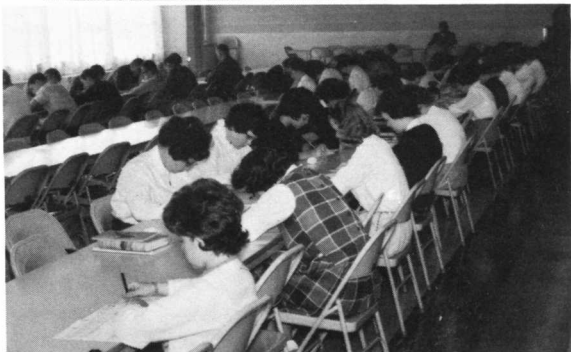

It is, in an effort to thank you for all you have done, that we dedicate our yearbook to you, Mr. Corbi.



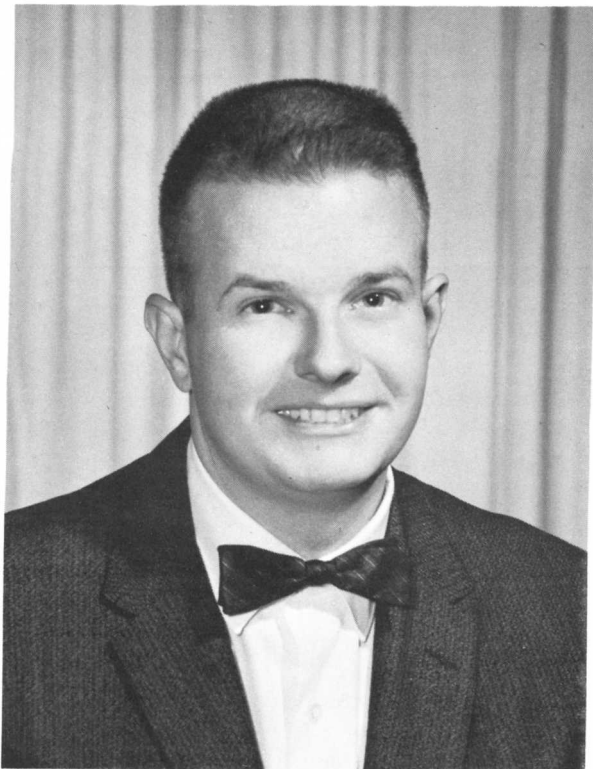

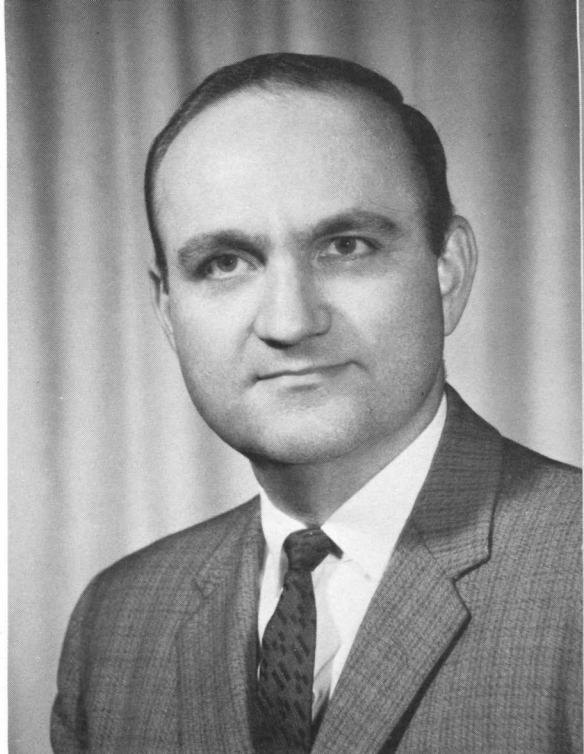

On October 19, 1962 Mr. David Paul, a world-wide traveler, presented films of Russia and gave an interesting account of his travels there.

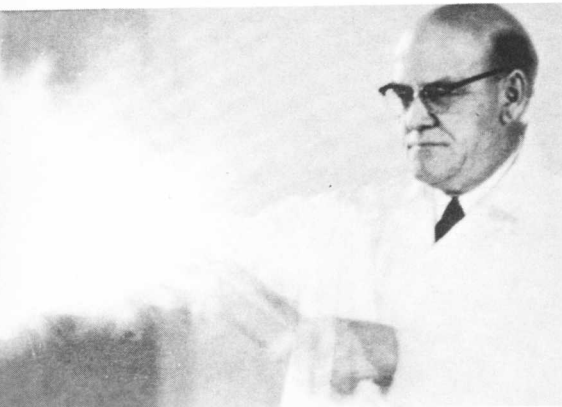

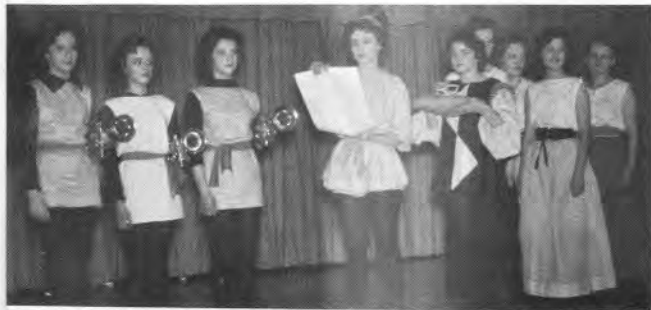
April 4 marked the date on which "The Lottery" was presented for judging in the County-District contest held in our high school.
