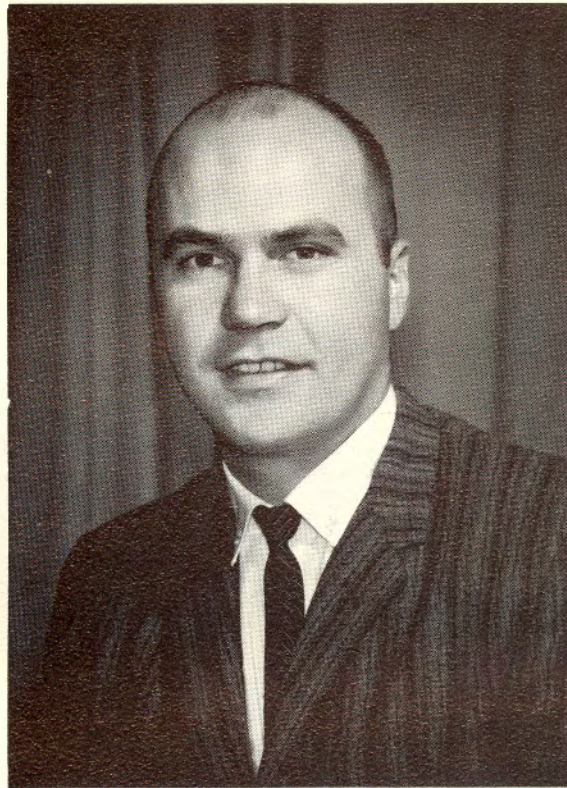

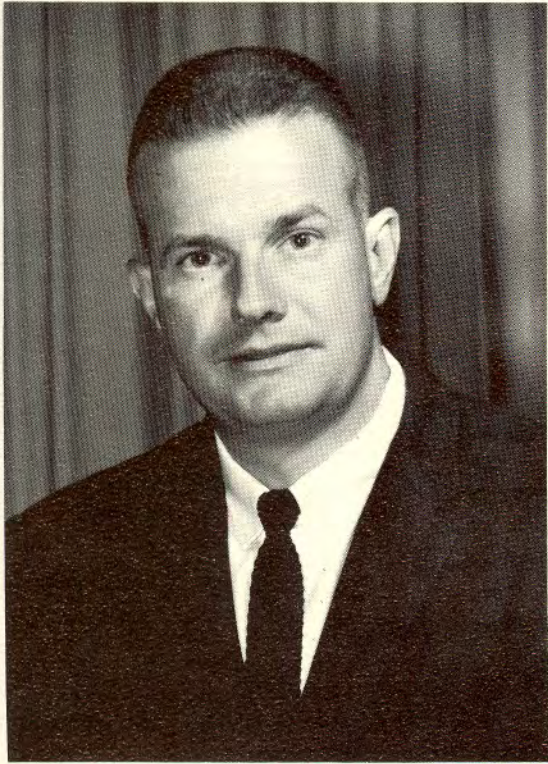

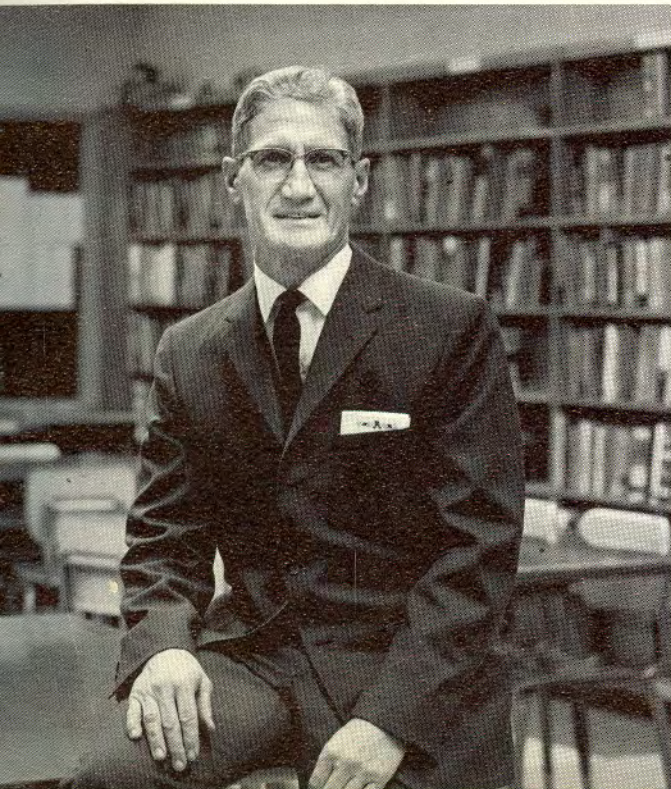
We wish to express our appreciation to Mr. Bair for the hard work and dedication that have made our football seasons so successful.
