Yes, it was quite a rousing start!

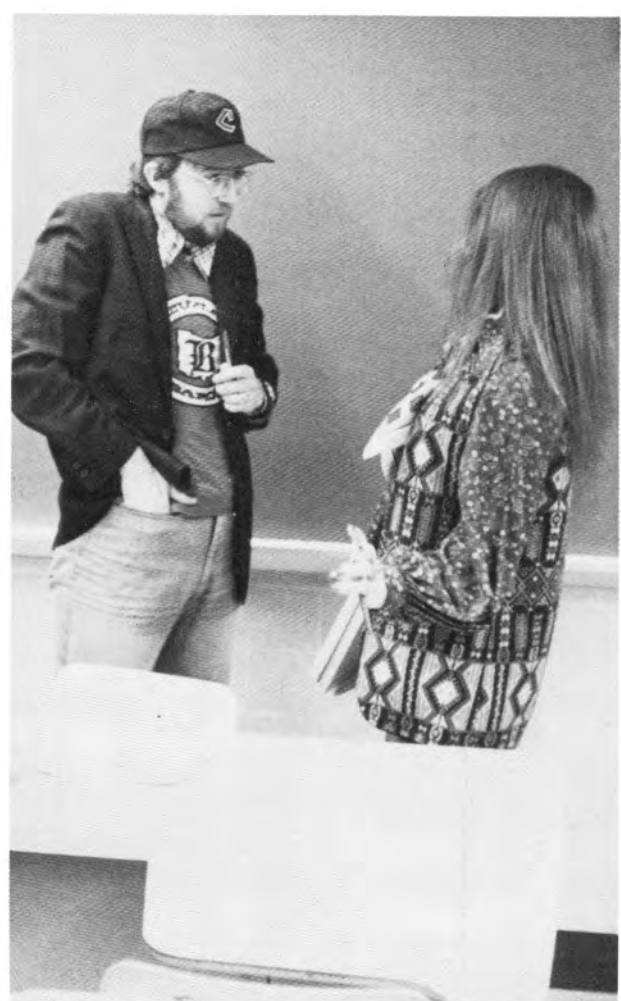

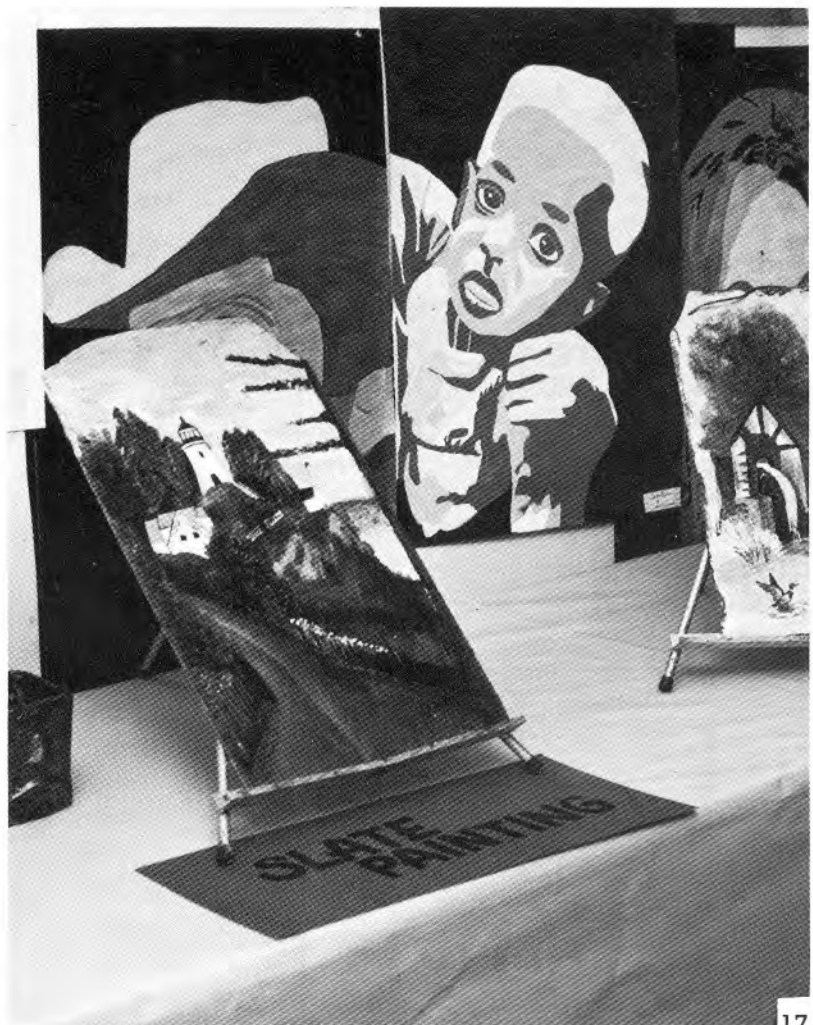
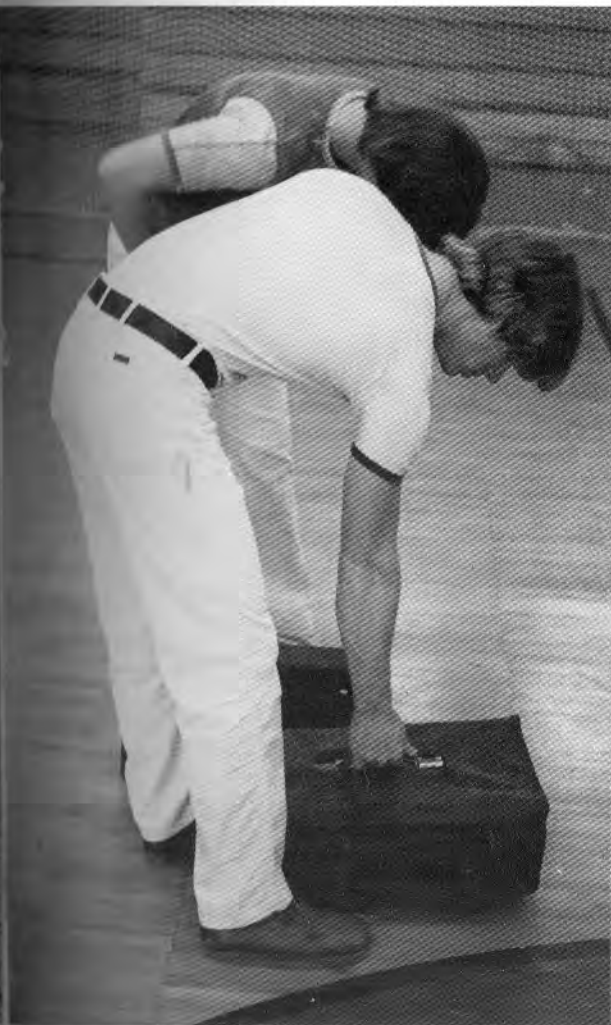
No matter what you wore, you were probably one of the millions of people who saw the resurrection of the classic hero—King Kong! He again reigned victorious in popularity.

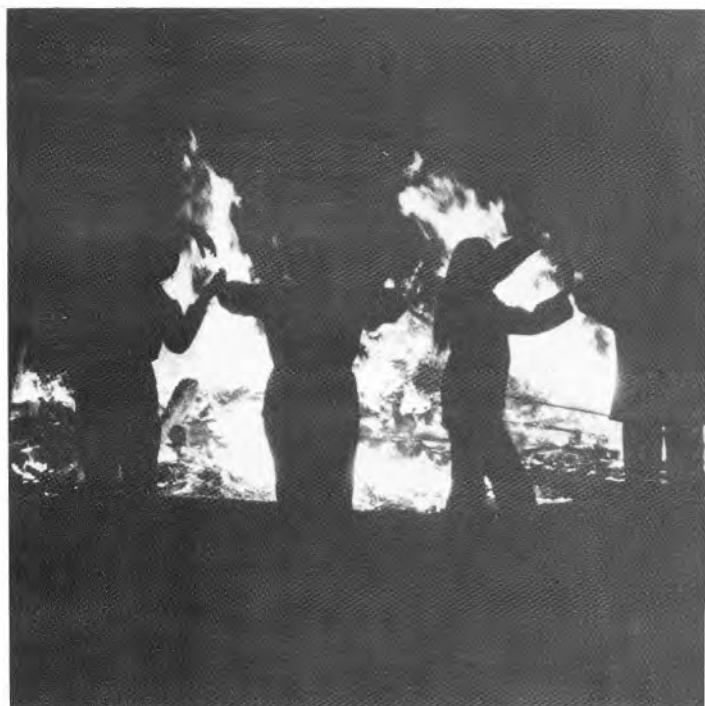


Homecoming Excitement

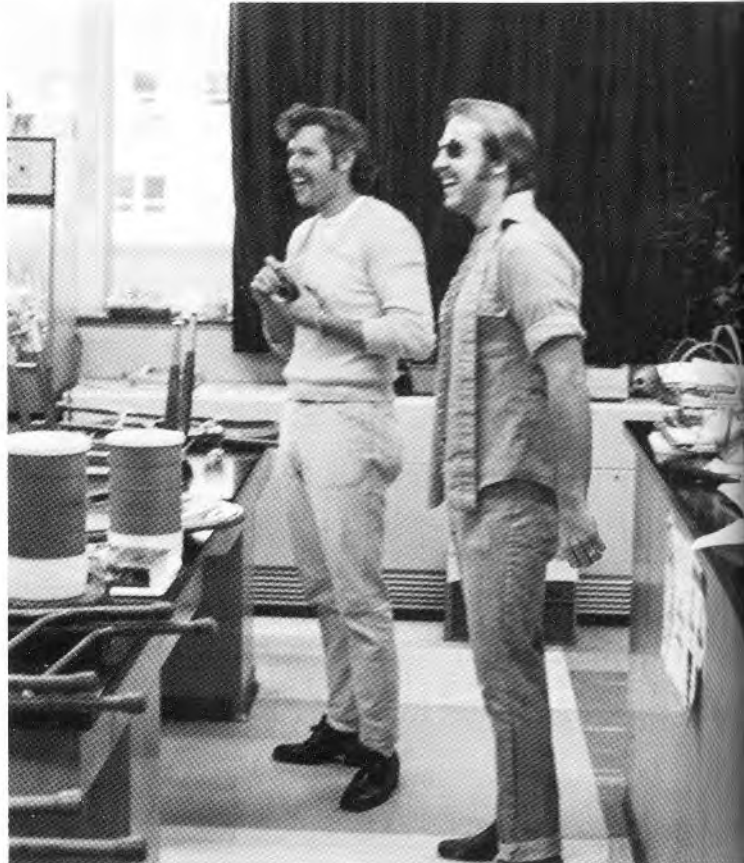

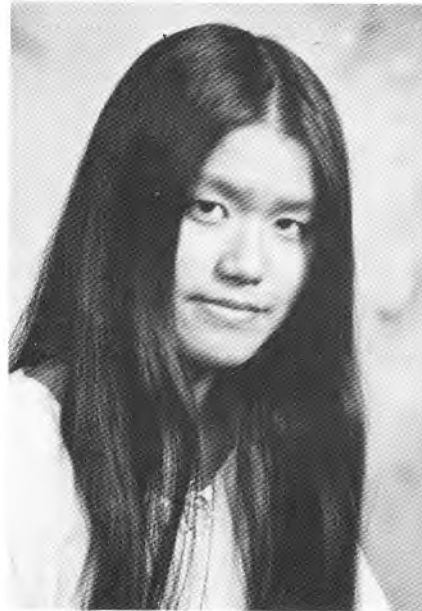

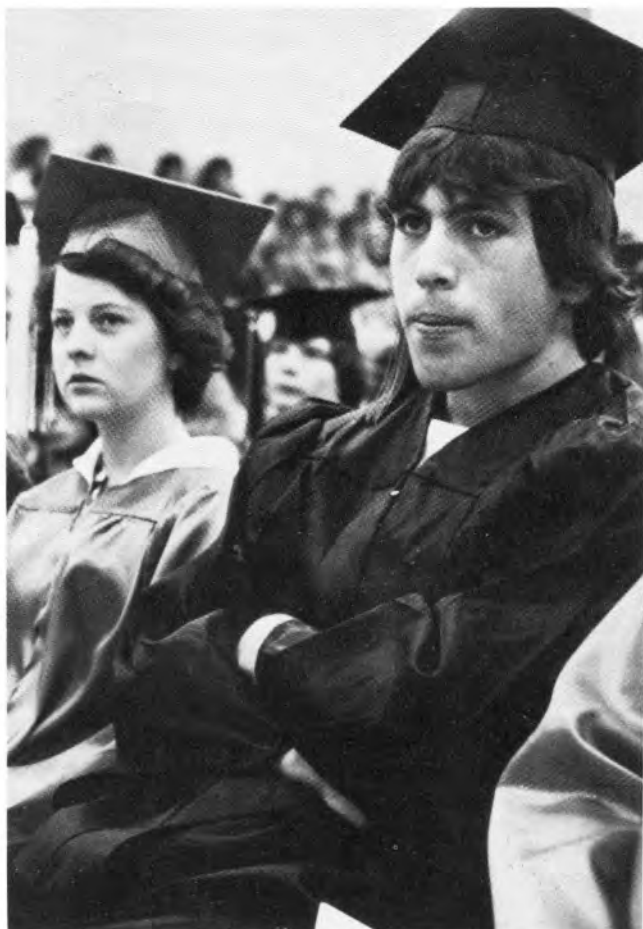
Graduation Excitement

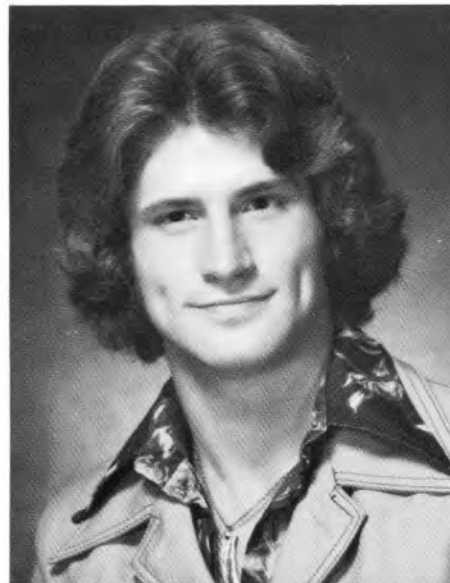


Guiding Seniors

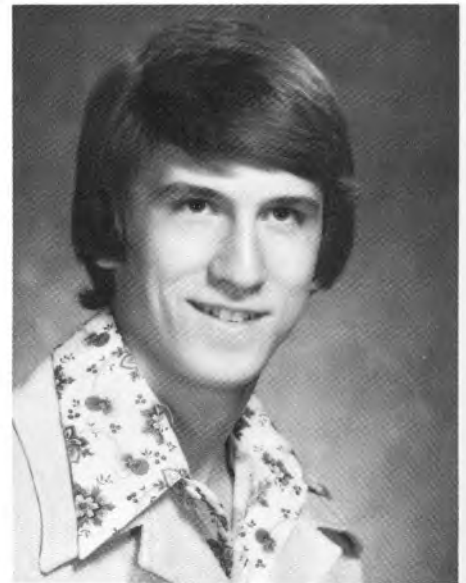

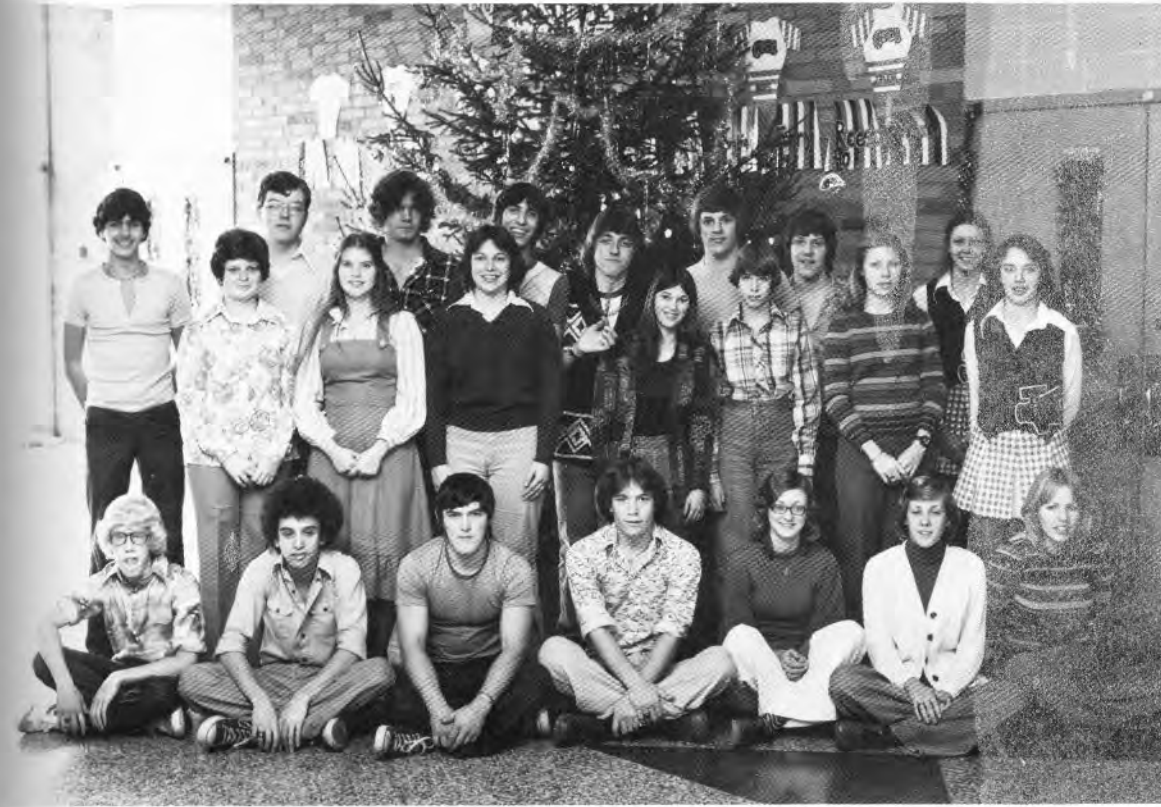

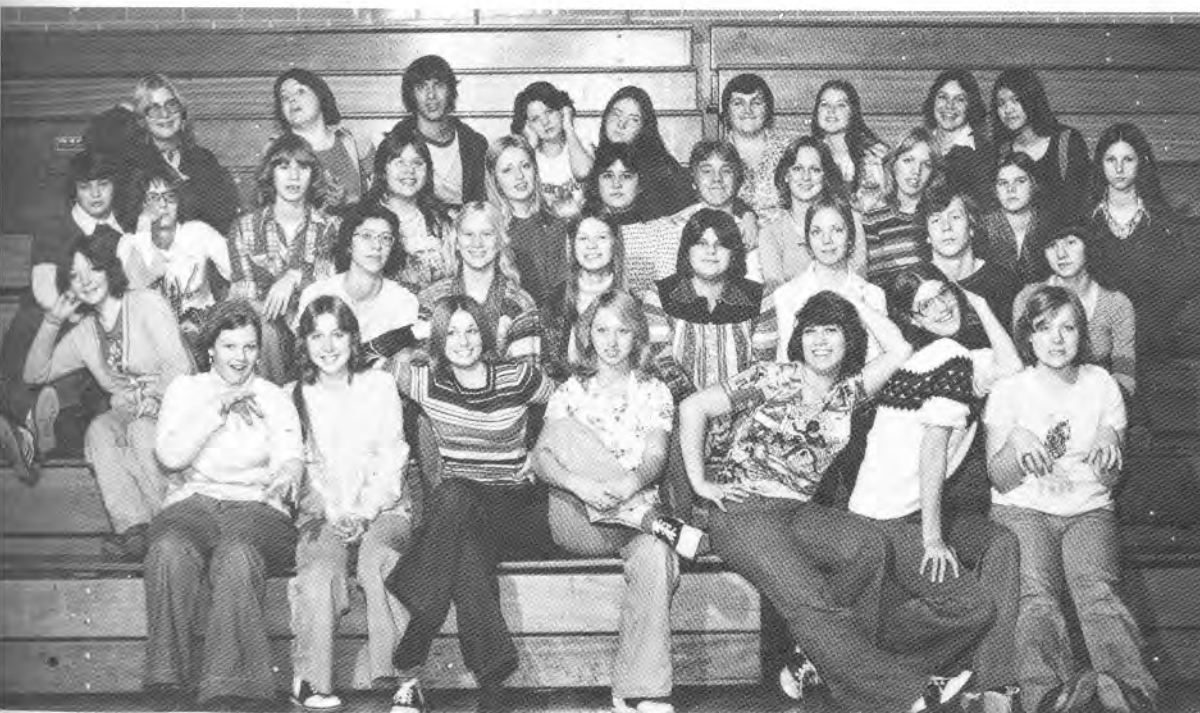
National Forensics League

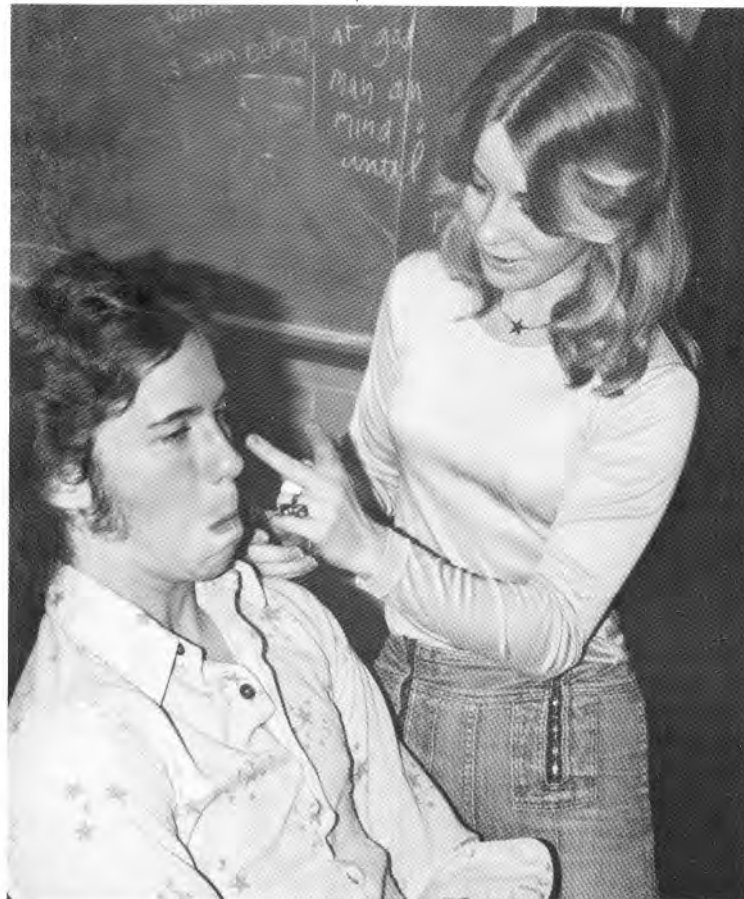

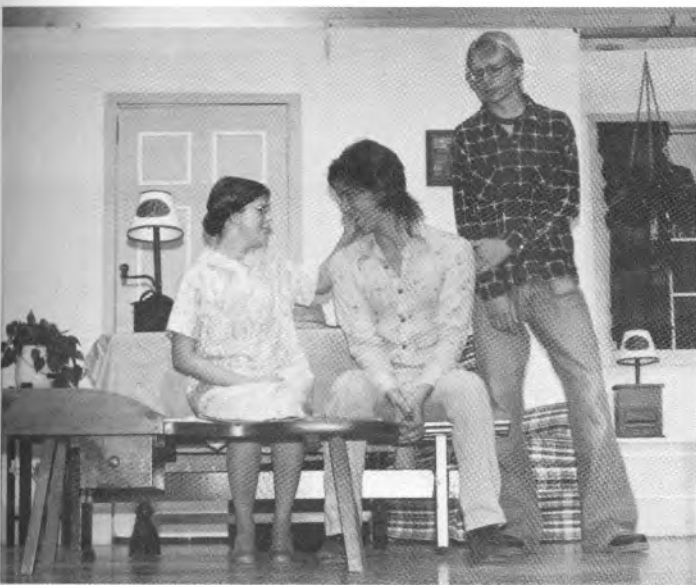

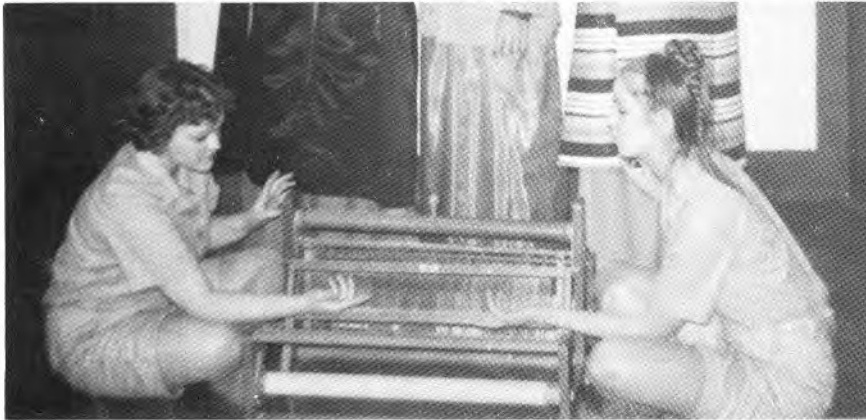

Better luck next year, when the competition will be held here at Tusky Valley.



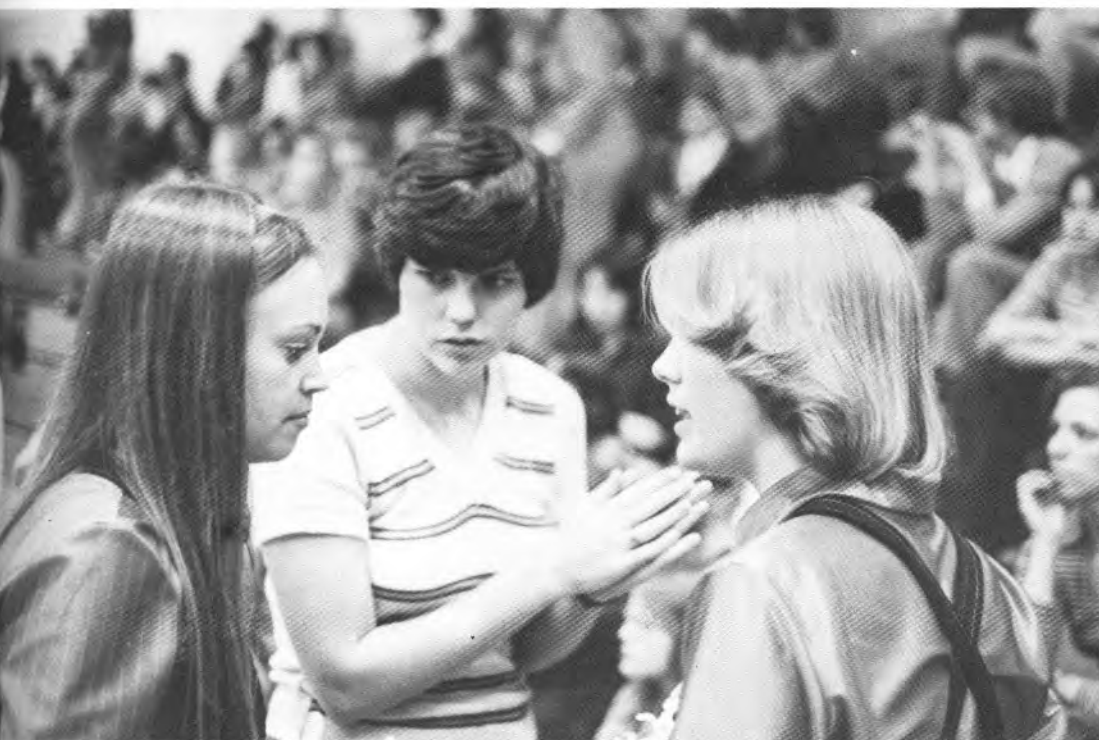

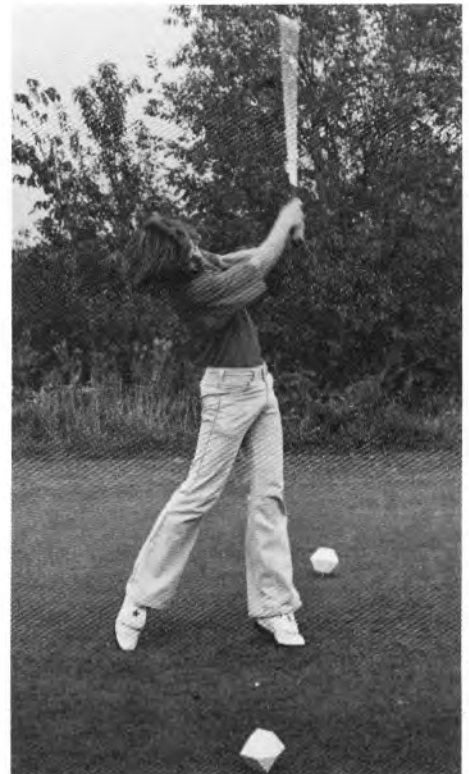

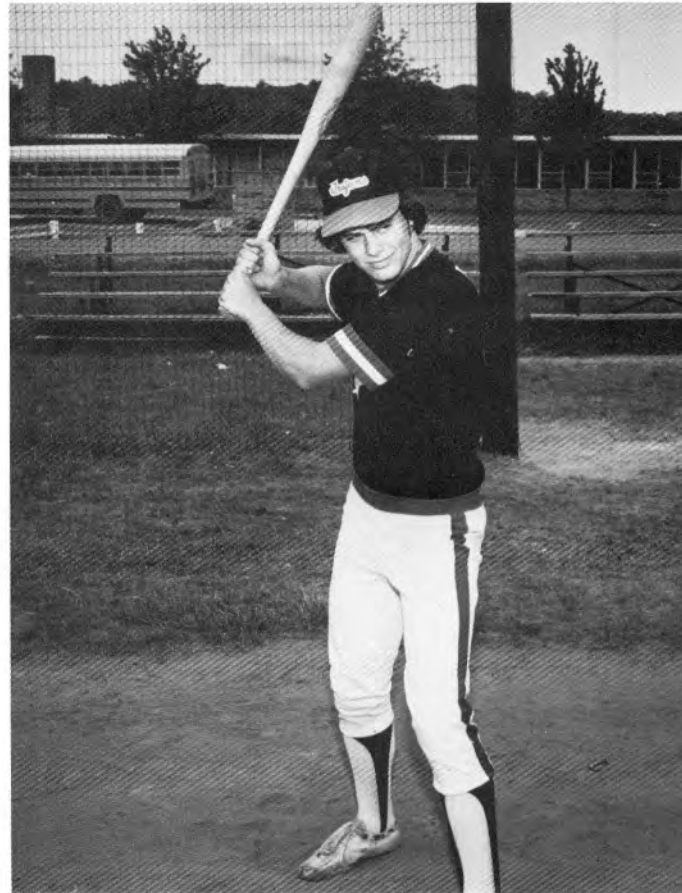

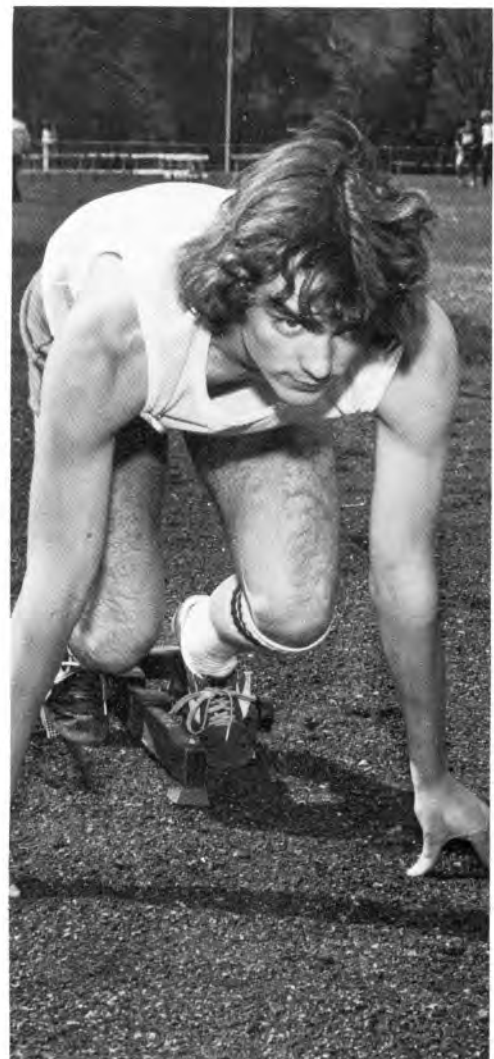

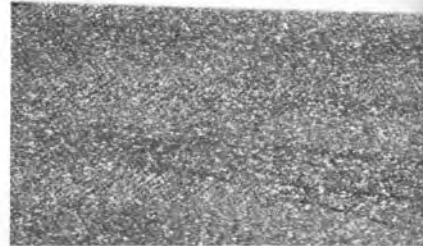

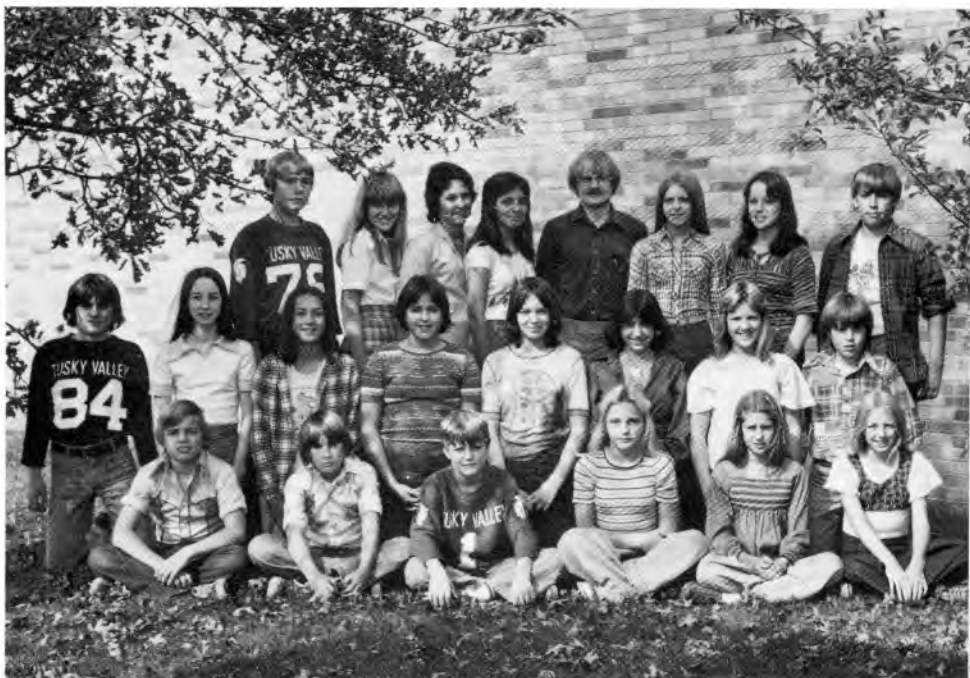

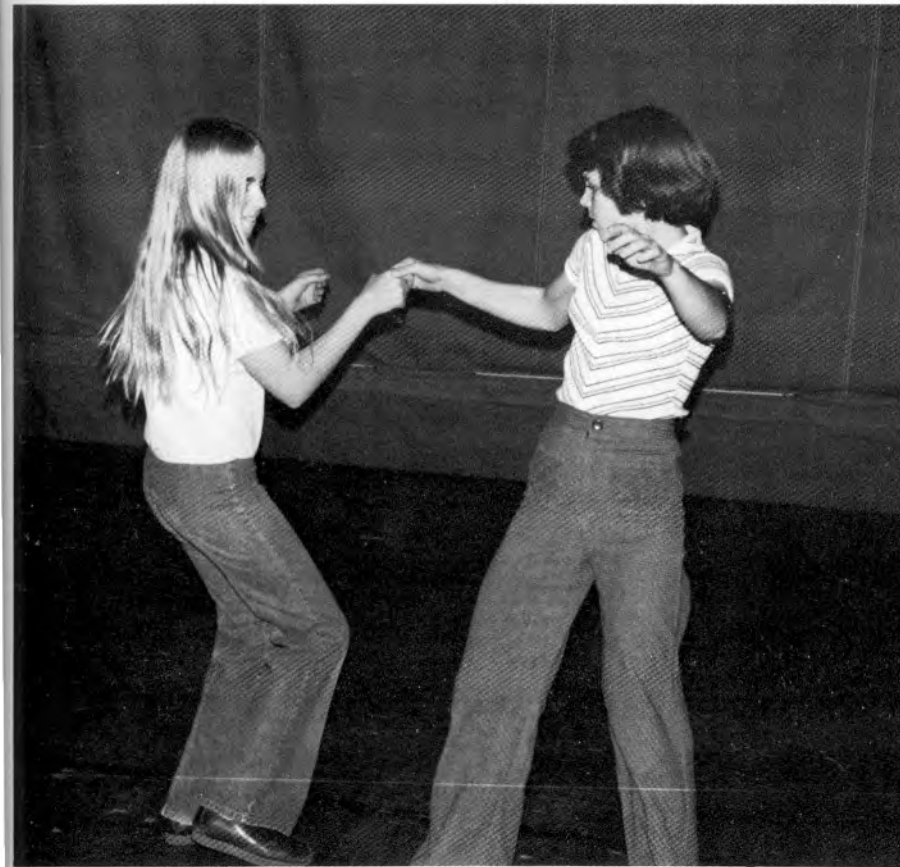
