It has been a fabulous start this fall! Now that the weather has cooled down, the students are enjoying time in their classrooms. I am very proud of all the students as they have surpassed my expectations with their school behavior. They have spent a lot of time reviewing our three school expectations: Be Safe, Be Respectful, and Be Responsible. We are also beginning to focus on seven practices that help students be happy and successful from the book. 7 Habits of Happy Kids. Out first habit was "Be Proactive". We discussed with students how they are in charge of their own actions. This habit focuses on responsibility, taking initiative, and choosing a positive attitude. We encourage students to do the right thing without being asked, and when no one is looking! We feel it is important to be good students and citizens. Take a minute to ask your child about being proactive. In October, we will focus on Habit 2: Begin with the End in Mind.

As the weather turns colder, please dress your child appropriately for outside recess. We ask for students to wear layers for cold mornings, but warmer afternoons. If you are sending in a sweatshirt, please make sure to label it with your child's initials in case it is misplaced. That helps us get it back to the rightful owner.

PROCEDURE UPDATE

Now that everyone has settled in and routines are set, I ask that parents say goodbye to their child at the front doors each morning and allow them to walk to their lockers and classrooms independently. This is a skill that all the teachers and students have been working on and makes for a smoother start each day. If you would like to talk with your child's teacher, please make arrangements prior to that morning so that the teacher can be prepared to find coverage for their room if necessary.

Parents are welcome to come visit their child during lunch for special occasions. We ask that parents either purchase a school lunch or bring a packed lunch for themselves. We do not allow for fast food (McDonald's, Wendy's, Subway, pizza, etc.) to be brought into the school for parents or students. Please let the office know through a note or phone call if you will be attending lunch for the day. We ask that parents not follow their student to recess. We encourage the children to play with other children and will often be distracted by visitors on the playground.

ABSENCES and VACATIONS

- 1. If your child will be leaving for an appointment during the school day, please call or send a note to verify the time he/she will be leaving. This allows the teacher to have them prepared for this absence.
- When your child will not be in attendance for the day, it is required that you call the school office or leave a message at the school to report their absence. Please provide the student's name, date and reason. If a call is not received, Mrs. Martin will send an automated call to remind you that this needs to be reported.
- 3. Upon returning from an absence, please send a written note with a reason or doctor's excuse.
- 4. Tusky Valley does allow up to 5 days of vacation leave per year for students. If a situation arises that your child will need to leave town with your family or a family vacation was planned that could not be taken within scheduled school breaks, you will need to apply for a vacation leave. A letter needs to be sent to the school office at least 5 days prior to the absence. Approval of the absence will then be sent home and to the teacher as confirmation. This allows the teacher to provide missed materials to the student since they are responsible for any missed work while they are gone. For more information, please see the school handbook.
